I am looking to serve in a church or ministry which promotes a free grace Gospel—where the people are actively involved in reaching the lost (evangelism) and in the Great Commission (making disciples through spiritual multiplication). I am also seeking to find a church with a strong high school and college ministry where our four children (ages 13-19) may become involved.

Because my wife, Sue, and I have a financial support team through *Didasko Ministries, Inc.*, it is not necessary for me to be in a paid position with a church or ministry. I wish to use my training and gifts to assist in some or all of the following areas: evangelization of visitors, follow-up of new Believers, new member classes or interviews, baptism interviews, neighborhood evangelism, and equipping church members in evangelism, follow-up, and multiplication discipleship. Sue assists me in ministry on a part-time basis.

From February of 2006 to the present, Sue and I have been on the staff of Chestnut Ridge Church in Morgantown, WV. Our responsibilities have included sharing the Gospel with people interested in: baptism, church membership, and how to know for sure they will go to heaven when they die. We have conducted most of our church's adult baptism interviews (about 300 in 4 years) as well as new member interviews. We have also developed and taught a discipleship curriculum in both a lecture format and a small group format. From 2003-2006, we started an outreach ministry to people living in apartment complexes in College Station, TX. We shared the Gospel through door-to-door evangelism. Our ministry also included one-on-one basic follow-up and discipleship. We both taught Sunday School classes at our church (Hope Evangelical Free Church), and were involved in sharing the Gospel door-to-door (near our church) with our Pastor and his wife.

From 2000-2003, we were involved with a ministry to church visitors at Plano Bible Chapel in Plano, TX. We called all church visitors, answered any questions they had, and offered to meet with them in our home. We then had the opportunity to share the Gospel on many of those appointments. We distributed "Jesus Film" videos to over 250 homes in our neighborhood. We also did extensive neighborhood (door-to-door) evangelism in our neighborhood and in the neighborhoods near our church. I taught Sunday School and a "Foundations of the Christian Faith" class at our church. We helped to write a brochure to use in sharing the Gospel with our church's visitors. From 1990-2000, I served as the "unofficial" Chaplain for the Texas Tech University football team in Lubbock, TX. My responsibilities included meeting with all of the new players each year to share the Gospel with them (first as a group, and then individually). I taught "Team Bible Study", began "Team Chapel Services", did one-on-one basic follow-up with new Believers, and disciplined and trained players each year in evangelism and multiplication discipleship. In 1998, I also developed and taught a class in our church on evangelism, follow-up, and multiplication discipleship.

From 1986-1990, I served as the "unofficial" Chaplain for the West Virginia University football team in Morgantown, WV, doing much of the same ministry activities that I did later, at Texas Tech University (see previous paragraph). My wife and I also attended and served in a small home church which grew to the current Chestnut Ridge Church (over 3,000 attendees) where my wife and I are currently on staff. (See third paragraph.)

From 1983-1986, I was the "unofficial" Chaplain of the football team at West Chester University in West Chester, PA. After meeting my wife, we were married in August of 1985. Sue moved from Boston (where she had been on staff with Campus Crusade for Christ at Boston College since 1982) to West Chester and joined *Didasko Ministries, Inc.* staff.

From 1981-1983, I began a ministry of evangelism and discipleship with college athletes at Texas Tech University in Lubbock, TX—first with the baseball team, and later with the football team.

From 1978 to 1981, I continued directing a Singles ministry in Dallas, TX, begun by Campus Crusade for Christ. In 1978, I switched my financial support team base from Campus Crusade for Christ to *Didasko Ministries, Inc.* by whom the government has considered me "self-employed."

From 1974 to 1978, I was on the full-time staff of Campus Crusade for Christ. My first assignment with Campus Crusade was Dallas, TX, where I served in the Lay Ministry—training pastors and laymen in evangelism and

discipleship. I was one of the four Regional Coordinators with the “Here’s Life, Dallas!” campaign. From 1976 until 1978, I ministered as Director of the Dallas Singles Ministry. During those years, along with the singles ministry, I also served as a campus staff member at the University of Oklahoma from 1977-1978, and I completed my diploma from The International Christian Graduate University School of Theology in 1978.

For 20 years, I was either on full-time staff with Campus Crusade for Christ, serving as “Volunteer Staff” with Campus Crusade in the campus and lay ministries, or serving as “Volunteer Staff” with Athletes in Action from 1974 until 1993. I served in a staff capacity with CCC on 7 summer projects: Korea (1974), Santa Cruz, CA (1977), Poland (1981), and Tokyo, Japan (1982, 1983, 1984, and 1986). Since 1993, I have not been attached to Campus Crusade for Christ in a staff or volunteer capacity, but have been supported through *Didasko Ministries, Inc.*

I grew up in Pecos, TX, and graduated with a BS in Industrial Technology from Texas A&M University (1971) where I held several leadership positions in the Corps of Cadets. Upon graduation, I was commissioned as an Air Force officer and served as a Missile Launch Officer at Minot Air Force Base, ND. From 1971-1973, I was very involved in ministry at First Baptist Church of Minot, ND (North American Baptist General Convention). It was at this church where I fully understood the concept of the Spirit-filled life, and where I began sharing my faith in Christ for the first time. When the Viet Nam War ended, I applied for and received an “early out” from the Air Force. I moved back to Texas, and became involved in ministry at Melonie Park Baptist Church of Lubbock, TX, before attending Moody Bible Institute’s Advanced Studies Program for one semester. In January of 1974, I joined the full-time staff of Campus Crusade for Christ. That same year, I was Licensed to preach the Gospel by my home church, First Baptist Church of Pecos, TX (Southern Baptist Convention).
